Start your week in Priest Lake, Idaho (September 12-14)

Nestled in the woods and lined by the Selkirk Mountain Range, just two hours north of Coeur d'Alene, lies Priest Lake. Come join us "Way Out West, Where the Mountains Meet the Lakes", to the most northern portion of the Idaho Panhandle, just 15 miles from the Canadian border. Priest Lake is 25 miles long and is surrounded by 80 miles of shoreline with sandy beaches that include seven islands. The Upper Lake, as it's called and the main lake, Priest Lake, are connected by a three mile long, slow moving scenic river called the "Thoroughfare". Moose, bear, deer and cougar are some of the familiar sights as you travel along this beautiful region. Once you have checked in Sunday afternoon, with most of you at Hill's or Elkins Resorts, relax and reconnect with old friends while enjoying a huckleberry cocktail and meet new ones until the "Welcome Aboard" party begins, hosted at Hill's Resort. Monday morning, you are on your own so get yourself a hearty breakfast at your resort. Don't worry, if you're not bringing a boat, we will find you a boat to ride in. Elkins Resort is our launching spot for the boat cruise to the Upper Lake. Once we reach the end of the Upper Lake, we will head back down the lake to Hill's Resort for a beach side buffet lunch. After lunch, you will be on your own and can spend the rest of the day cruising the other parts of Priest Lake or head back to your cabin and relax. Monday night's dinner will be hosted and held at Elkins Resort, a five-star resort, for a delicious prime rib, salmon & chicken entree with all the fixings. Start your engine early Tuesday morning, as we cruise over to Cavanaugh's Resort for a tasty breakfast. After a great meal, we will continue south down the lake for a tour of the south end of Priest Lake. A late check out has been arranged at your resort before you head out to Coeur d'Alene. Start your week in Coeur D'Alene, Idaho (September 13-14)

Monday 9/13 - Wallace, Idaho - Silver Mine Tour

Wallace Idaho (the entire town is on the National Historic Register) and the surrounding area are recognized as the richest silver mining district on earth having produced 1.2 billion ounces since 1884. Hop on the Sierra Silver Mine trolley in downtown Wallace and dig a little deeper into these rich mountains and their storied past. On the tour, an experienced miner guides you through the main drift of an actual underground silver mine. Exhibits and demonstrations of mining equipment present historic and modern techniques used to mine silver, gold, lead, zinc, and copper. Your guide will share his experiences as a hard-rock miner in the Coeur d'Alene District. The stories, demonstrations, and exhibits included in the Sierra Silver Mine Tour are entertaining and educational for visitors of all ages and interests. Tuesday 9/14 Cruise from Coeur d'Alene to Harrison, Idaho

Visit historic Harrison Idaho. The community was founded in 1899 and named after U.S. President Benjamin Harrison. Harrison once was the largest city on Lake Coeur d'Alene. Logging and mining fueled the economy. Harrison is located approximately 16 miles down lake from Coeur d'Alene. The guided trip will begin at the gas dock on the Coeur d'Alene Resort Board Walk at 10:00am. You'll travel along the eastern shore of Lake Coeur d'Alene-down to Harrison approximately an hour and half to two hours. Lunch in Harrison will be at "One Shot Charlies" (they'll tell you what the "one shot" means). Lunch is lasagna, salad, breadsticks and a soft-drink for \$17.50 (payable to the restaurant) if time permits, a "cruise" up the Coeur d'Alene River may be possible. Coeur d'Alene Events (September 15-16)

Wednesday 9/15 Spokane River Breakfast/Poker Run

Departing the Coeur d'Alene Resort Boardwalk Marina at 8am rendezvous at the mouth of the Spokane River near Cedars floating restaurant at 8:15. At 8:30 we will arrive at Le Peep restaurant to pick up your first card and breakfast burrito. From there you will enjoy a nine mile ride along the Spokane River to Post Falls, Idaho. There will be seven stops at Inland Empire Chapter members' homes along the way where you will pick up a playing card for the poker run. Many of the stops will offer boaters a beverage or snack to enjoy as you cruise the scenic ride down the river. The run should take approximately three hours. This will allow you time to return to the resort in time for the McEuen Park BBQ. The winner of the poker run will be announced and an award will be presented at the BBQ for the best poker hand. BBQ by Drummon Catering at McEuen Park. The Park is adjacent to the Coeur d'Alene Resort.

The park boasts the city's largest playground, a colorful splash pad, tennis/pickle ball court, basketball court, off-leash dog park, Avista Pavilion, the Rotary Harbor House (waterfront concession stand/restroom facility), the sea wall overlook, grand plaza, Veterans Memorial, and 4-acre grassy area with room to hold events for up to 5,000 people. Thursday 9/16 Tour StanCraft Boats Facility and the Bird Aviation Museum

Enjoy the one hour tour (starting at 10am) of the state of the art boat building facility located in Hayden, Idaho, a short 15 minute drive from the Coeur d'Alene Resort. Tour the facility with owner Robb Bloem and his team from the very initial stages of design, to framing to finish and upholstery. StanCraft was founded in 1933 by W.H. "Billy" Young and his son Stanley C. Young on Flathead Lake, Montana in the town of Lakeside. Syd and Julie Young took over the company in 1968. In the early 1980's the company relocated to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Syd Young's son-in-law and youngest daughter now own the company and continue the StanCraft tradition of high-performance, elegant and state of the art wood boats. The Bird Aviation museum houses a collection of vintage aircraft and automobiles. A short walk from the StanCraft facility. Take flight at The Bird Aviation Museum and Invention Center while touring 16,000 square feet of innovation and aviation. The focus of the museum is honoring the historic contributions of aviators and innovators who have helped create modern technology and celebrate these individuals who have forever changed the way we live. *Note: A preserved boat has at least 60% of the original deck and topside wood remaining, not including the bottom. A restored boat has less than 60% original wood remaining, not including the bottom. Space in the boat show may be limited. Entries are processed in the order in which they are received. All boats must remain in place on Friday and Saturday (no launching boats after 8:00 am on Friday) All boats must be operational. All boats to be judged must be in the water with the exception of canoes and small rowboats and boats subject to sinking, such as a Hydroplane with open sponges, when not moving. An exception to the rule is boats damaged during the Pre-Events may be judged on the trailer if the damage creates an unsafe situation for the boats. All boats judged must come to the docks by their own power with the exception of direct drive boats, which may be towed to the dock.

Insurance Waiver for All Boat Show Entrants

This statement certifies that I am the owner of the boat being registered. I am participating in the 2021 Antique and Classic Boat Society Inc's International Boat Show and/or the Pre-Events sponsored by Antique and Classic Boat Society and hosted by the Inland Empire Chapter. This event will take place at the Coeur d'Alene Resort September 16-18, 2021. Pre-Events during September 12-16, 2021 will be held at several locations in Northern Idaho.

Owners who want boats judged are encouraged to be present at their boat when it is judged. By registering a boat to be judged, the owners explicitly grant permission for the judges to board their boat as needed to properly judge it, should the owner not be present. Judges are experienced in these matters and take due care; however, owners agree that neither judges nor the sponsoring organization nor ACBS are liable for any damage that may occur during the judging process.

Further, I certify I currently have effective insurance to cover my liability for any damages to others, or their property, arising from any use of my boat during this event.
